**Call to Worship and Lighting of the Advent Candles

Reader One: Every journey faces the unknown. And anxiety can sometimes overwhelm us. There is too much to do; our lists are long; our calendars are filled up; we worry that something will go wrong, or we won't end up in the right place or take the right route. Getting lost is a real possibility on a journey. And yet. We claim **hope** for the journey, because we follow the one who will travel with us and sustain us on the way. This journey prepares the way of the Lord.

All: Let's prepare the way of the Lord!

Reader Two: Isaiah says that there is one who is to come who will be the fulfillment of all our hope. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on this one, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. We place our hope in this one.

Reader One: On this first Sunday of Advent, we light the candle of **prophecy** and **hope** to give us strength for the journey. (Light the first Advent candle)

Reader Two: Come, let's journey together in **hope** as we begin the season of Advent. Let's bring hope into the world, as a light in the darkness. **All: Let's listen to the prophecy of Isaiah and prepare the way of the Lord with HOPE!**
